Bylaw of Postgraduate Studies

Introduction:

Faculty of Nursing at Tanta University began its educational mission under the title the Higher Institute of Nursing in 1983 based on the decree No. 942 of 1976 issued by the Prime Minister. The duration of study at the institute was four years. Girls were graduated as nursing supervisors having the Bachelor's degree in Nursing Sciences. The actual study began at the institute in the academic year 1982\1983.

Recognizing Nursing as one of the most vital and significant specializations in offering health services to the patient and as one of the largest sector that provides health institutions with their needs of required human health resources at the level of all governorates in the Republic and at both regional and international levels; the republican decree No. 200 of 2000 was issued regarding change of the institute into a separate Faculty.

The ministerial decree No. 966 was issued on July 9, 2000 concerning formulation of an internal bylaw of Faculty of Nursing at Tanta University (for the Bachelor and postgraduate stages). Study of the master's and PhD degrees started with effect from the academic year 2000-2001 and study of diploma started with effect from the academic

year 2011-2012. Men joined the Faculty in the academic year 2010-2011 and joined postgraduate studies in November 2014.

Vision of the Faculty

The Faculty seeks to play a distinguished educational role at the national, regional and international levels that participates in preparation of generations of graduates who have the ability of renovation, innovation and dealing with modern technological methods through education, continuous training and conducting distinctive scientific research that serves all.

Mission of the Faculty

Through its integrative system, Faculty of Nursing aims to graduate a nurse (men or women) with outstanding efficiency according to the local and international criteria. In addition, it aims to offer scientific solutions and specialized consultations via scientific nursing research. Moreover, it takes part in protecting society from health and environmental hazards.

Objectives of the Faculty:

The Faculty aims to present educational programs that prepare cadres able to offer nursing care to individuals and groups. Through its objectives, it prepares students to:

1. Offer a comprehensive nursing care to individuals with different ages and at all health levels according to analysis and identification of bodily, psychological and environmental needs of individual, family and community.
2. Use information and recent technology in cooperation with medical team in order to improve health and achieve welfare of individual and community.

3. Apply theories and research of nursing, basic, social and human sciences as a foundation for professional nursing practice.
4. Apply continuous education to develop self and professional abilities in order to introduce changes in health care.
5. Abide by professional responsibility during participation in planning and management of health care in cooperation with medical team and community organizations to meet health needs of community and to develop health care.
6. Use scientific research approach and apply results of research in making suitable change to upgrade nursing care systems.

Department of the Faculty and Scientific Specializations:

Article (1):

The Faculty consists of seven departments namely:

1. Department of Medical, Surgical and Critical Care Nursing

It includes the following three main scientific areas:

- Basic sciences of nursing.

Article (2):

The Degree of Diploma of Nursing

Article (13):

- Medical and Surgical Nursing
- Maternal, Obstetric and Gynecological Nursing
- Nursing Services Administration
- Community Health Nursing
- Pediatric Nursing
- Psychiatric and Mental Health Nursing
- Critical Care Nursing
- Geriatric Nursing
- Teaching of Nursing
- Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS) and AIDS Prevention Nursing

Article (14):

The Diploma of Nursing aims to prepare students scientifically and practically in different specializations in nursing.

Article (15):

To enroll a student in study of one specialized diplomas, the following conditions are applied:

1. A student has to have gained the Bachelor's degree in Nursing from an Egyptian university with an estimation of at least "Good"

or an equivalent degree from another scientific institute acknowledged by the University.

2. A student has to have practiced the profession of nursing for a period that is not less than two years after a training year in a public or private hospital or another scientific institute acknowledged by the University.
3. A student's attendance percentage must not be less than 75% in the curricula ratified by Faculty Council in the specialization he is enrolled in.
4. A student must be tenured for study at the Faculty for one year at least.
5. Approval from workplace is a must.

Article (16):

Study includes scientific specialized curricula in branches of specialization for one year.

Article (17):

Enrollment in the diploma begins in August every year and study begins in October every year.

Article (18):

The duration of study for gaining the degree of Diploma of Nursing in one year. A student cannot be enrolled in study for more than two years. Faculty Council is authorized to allow her another year.

Article (19):

The special study in each specialization includes the following:
